STANFORD TO HONOR SLAIN WALL STREET JOURNAL REPORTER WITH *HARMONY FOR HUMANITY*: DANIEL PEARL WORLD MUSIC DAYS CONCERT ON OCTOBER 8 AT MEMORIAL CHURCH

**Free event, co-presented by Stanford Lively Arts and Music at Stanford,
will feature talents of Stanford students and faculty**

Stanford, CA, September 11, 2009— As a prelude to the official season opener, Lively Arts and Music at Stanford co-present *Harmony for Humanity*, the annual **Daniel Pearl World Music Days Concert** on Thursday, October 8 at 8:00 p.m. in Memorial Church. This free tribute— honoring the life and memory of the slain Wall Street Journal reporter, musician, and Stanford graduate Daniel Pearl—features the talents of Stanford's Department of Music with performances by **St. Lawrence String Quartet** members **Scott St. John**, **Geoff Nuttall**, and **Christopher Costanza**, violinist **Livia Sohn**, composer **Mark Applebaum**, Stanford's **Talisman** a cappella ensemble, and others.

Daniel Pearl World Music Days was created in response to the 2002 kidnapping and murder of Wall Street Journal reporter and Stanford University graduate Daniel Pearl at the hands of extremists in Karachi, Pakistan. Daniel's family and friends came together to work towards a more humane world, forming the Daniel Pearl Foundation, promoting cross-cultural understanding through journalism, music, and innovative communications.
